AMENDMENT TO H.R. 34 OFFERED BY M.R. WEBER

At the end of the bill, add the following:

1	SEC. 7. SENSE OF CONGRESS.
2	It is the sense of Congress that—
3	(1) the enactment of policies included in the
4	resolution H. Res 109, entitled "Recognizing the
5	duty of the Federal Government to create a Green
6	New Deal" and introduced in the House of Rep-
7	resentatives in the 116th Congress, would—
8	(A) increase housing, energy, and food
9	prices for all individuals in the United States,
10	with a burden of cost estimated at \$60,000 per
11	household in the United States; and
12	(B) cause significant and immediate dam-
13	age to the economy of the United States; and
14	(2) a more effective means for addressing com-
15	plex, global challenges like climate change require
16	robust investments in basic and fundamental re-
17	search to accelerate the development of innovative
18	clean energy technologies in the United States,
19	which is best accomplished by—

1	(A) supporting existing research and devel-
2	opment programs, such as research exploring
3	the energy-water nexus, at the Department, in-
4	stitutes of higher education (as defined in sec-
5	tion 101 of the Higher Education Act of 1965
6	(20 U.S.C. 1001)), and the National Labora-
7	tories (as defined in section 2 of the Energy
8	Policy Act of 2005 (42 U.S.C. 15801));
9	(B) removing bureaucratic barriers and de-
10	veloping new pathways for innovators, investors,
11	and decisionmakers to leverage the resources of
12	the Department; and
13	(C) investing in cooperative research and
14	development with international partners focused
15	on developing clean, affordable, reliable, and re-
16	silient energy technologies that are globally
17	competitive without the support of the Federal
18	Government.
