Members' Day Hearing: House Science, Space, and Technology Committee May 17, 2019

Good morning. I would like to welcome everyone to the Member Day Hearing for the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology for the 116th Congress. Today's Member Day Hearing gives Members, including those NOT on the committee, the opportunity to come before us and discuss proposed legislation, or simply discuss interests and priorities under the Committee's jurisdiction.
