Dear Sirs:

Thank you for your letter dated August 22, 2016, wherein you included a subpoena ordering the production of documents relating to "former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton's use of a private email account and server during her time at the State Department." Platte River Networks (PRN) appreciates the opportunity to publicly respond to your questions. However, at this point, PRN has nothing to produce that is responsive to your subpoena.

Referring to the schedule following the subpoena, the first three questions relate specifically to "private servers or networks used by Secretary Clinton for official purposes." PRN had no relationship with former Secretary Clinton during her time in office. Therefore, PRN is unable to produce any materials relating thereto.

The fourth question requests "[a]ll documents and communications referring or relating to the National Institute of Standards and Technology's Framework for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity or the Federal Information Security Management Act ("FISMA")." PRN has no material relating thereto.

Of course, PRN wishes to be helpful, so we invite you to reformulate your inquiry. However, it seems worth pointing out that as PRN never interacted with former Secretary of State Clinton in her official capacity, it seems that PRN's relationship with Clinton falls outside the stated interest of your committee ("...examining former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton's use of a private email account and server during her time at the State Department.").
